

Medical Case Management Intern

RefugeeOne, located in Chicago's Uptown neighborhood, has a national reputation for its success in assisting refugees fleeing war and persecution as they build new lives.

With the help of 450 volunteers, RefugeeOne walks alongside refugees as they take their first steps on the road to self-reliance: we greet new arrivals at O'Hare Airport, furnish their first apartments, help them learn English, and connect them to their first jobs. However, we recognize that job skills aren't the only component to success in the United States, which is why we provide mental health care, after-school programming, and community-building services as well. Our ultimate goal is to help refugee families become self-reliant in as little as 6-12 months.

Responsibilities The Medical Case Manager Intern is responsible for assisting with all aspects of the case worker's job including:

- Making medical appointments, assisting clients in getting to appointments. Arrange transportation through Medicaid transportation and assist client with ADA Paratransit Service Applications.
- Research and connect clients to community resources addressing their current health needs Manage in home volunteer database and return communication as appropriate.
- Interpret if fluent in one or more of clients' preferred languages
- Update case notes of services provided weekly. The intern will carry an individual caseload of 5-7 cases at any time and will support all health stabilization efforts for those clients in collaboration with the Medical Case Manager.
- Assist with the planning and presentation of health education workshops as needed.

Requirements: Reliable and flexible. Organized with attention to detail. Able to work independently. Strong desire to help people and enthusiasm for working in a multi-cultural setting.

Bachelor's degree required or undergraduate senior majoring in psychology, public health, social work, anthropology and other sciences.

Graduate student majoring in social sciences including public health, social work, nursing, healthcare administration, and community health

Preferred: experience in medical settings, experience working with individuals and groups from diverse ethnic and faith communities. Fluent in more than one language including Arabic (preferred), French, Urdu, Rohingya, Burmese.
